

























### Katrina Nannestad Learning activities

#### Reflecting

- 1. Katrina Nannestad said that her childhood memories inspired the character of Lottie Perkins
  - a. Can you think of a memory from your own childhood that could be turned into a funny or interesting story?
  - b. What made-up details would you include to help bring it to life?
- 2. Katrina enjoys writing stories with a mystery. What genre do you enjoy reading the most funny stories, historical tales, mysteries or something else? Why?
- 3. In Rabbit, Soldier, Angel, Thief, the main character Sasha shows kindness during a time of war.
  - a. Think about a time when someone showed you kindness. How did it make you feel?
  - b. Why do you think kindness can be especially powerful during hard times?
- 4. Look through the resource page with Katrina Nannestad's books and blurbs. What would you most prefer to read and why?

#### **Creating**

- 1. Katrina Nannestad based Lottie Perkins around some of her own childhood memories.
  - a. Create your own fictional character inspired by you or someone you know.
  - b. Give them a name, describe their personality, and write a short story about one of their adventures
- 2. If you have read one or more of Katrina Nannestad's books, research and create a poster suggesting similar books to read next.
- 3. Choose your favouite Katrina Nannestad book and draw or digitally create a new book cover with image/s that captures the mood of the book and includes the book title and author.
- 4. Create a short, 30-60 second book trailer to promote your favourite Katrina Nannestad book.

Genre/s: Historical fiction

The Nazis want everyone to be the same. If you're different, you don't belong.

Not belonging is dangerous...

Anna's little sister, Eva, is frail and needs time to learn new things. She has a huge heart and a gift for loving, but Hitler doesn't value such riches. And so she's hidden away. Safe for now, but with the threat of discovery always near.

Anna does her best to bring joy and light to Eva's small life with stories, trinkets and treasures from the outside world. But soon, more children need hiding. Risks are taken - by Anna, by her best friend Udo, by a Nazi seamstress and feisty Brunhilde. Until Anna wonders if any of them will make it through the war...

### Silver Linings


Genre/s: Historical fiction

Nettie Sweeney has a dad, three big sisters, a farm full of cows and a cat called Mittens. But it's not enough. She longs for a mother. One with a gentle touch and sparkles in her eyes. Instead, she has Aunty Edith with slappy hands, a sharp tongue and the disturbing belief that peas are proper food.

When Dad marries Alice, all Nettie's dreams come true. The Sweeney home overflows with laughter, love and, in time, a baby brother. Billy. The light of Nettie's life. Then tragedy strikes. The Sweeney family crumbles. Nettie tries to make things right, but has she made everything so much worse?







### Waiting for the Storks

Genre/s: Historical fiction

I don't want to remember the truck, or the night I was taken, or the family I left behind. I am not a sad Polish girl. I am a good and happy German girl.

I am. I am. I am.

It's the Second World War and Himmler's Lebensborn Program is in full flight when eight-year-old Zofia Ulinski is kidnapped by the Germans. She has blonde hair and blue eyes, just like the other Polish children taken from their families and robbed of their names, their language, their heritage.

But when Zofia is adopted into a wealthy and loving German family, it is easier, it is safer to bury her past, deep down, so everything is forgotten. Until the Polish boy arrives.

And the past comes back to haunt her.

### Rabbit, Soldier, Angel, Thief

Genre/s: Historical fiction


Wood splinters and Mama screams and the nearest soldier seizes her roughly by the arms. My sister pokes her bruised face out from beneath the table and shouts, 'Run, Sasha! Run!'

But one small boy, alone in war-torn Russia, cannot survive. One small boy without a family cannot survive. One small boy without his home cannot survive. What that small boy needs is an army.






#### We are Wolves

Sometimes it's good to be wild.


Sometimes you have to be wild.

Sometimes to survive, you must become a wolf.



### The Girl Who Brought Mischief

Genre/s: Historical fiction

When Inge Maria arrives on the tiny island of Bornholm in Denmark to live with her grandmother, she's not sure what to expect.

Her grandmother is stern, the people on the island are strange, and children are not allowed to run wild or express themselves the way they did back in Copenhagen -- especially if you are a girl.

Inge Maria tries not to feel sorry for herself, but she misses her mama. And on top of everything else, mischief seems to have a way of finding her no matter how hard she tries to be good ... But could it be that a bit of mischief is exactly what Grandmother and the people of Bornholm need?





### Freja Peachtree series

Genre/s: Adventure, mystery

Book 1 in series: The Girl, the Dog and the Writer in Rome

For the first ten years of her life, Freja and her mother, Clementine have roamed the Arctic in search of zoological wonders. Happy, content, together. Freja and Clem. Clem and Freja. But now, everything is changing, and Clementine must send Freja away to live with her old friend Tobias, a bestselling crime writer and, quite possibly, the most absent-minded man on earth. Tobias is not used to life with a child, and Freja isn't used to people at all, but together they stumble into an Italian adventure so big that it will change things forever.

#### Olive of Groves series


**Genre/s:** Humour, school stories **Book 1 in series:** *Olive of Groves*

#### **Lottie Perkins series**


**Genre/s:** Early reader contemporary fiction **Book 1 in series:** *Lottie Perkins, Movie Star*

Blue Weston's life is spiralling out of control.




#### Reflecting

- 1. Each book in the *Emmie and Friends* focuses on a different character. Why do you think this makes the series interesting for readers?
- 2. In *Entirely Emmie*, Terri Libenson talks about turning class clown and bully Joe into a character who changes for the better. Have you ever read a book where a character suprised you like that? What changed your view of them?
- 3. Terri Libenson says graphic novels are a great way to get into reading. Do you agree? How do graphic novels help you enjoy or understand a story?
- 4. Look through the resource page with Terri Libenson's books and blurbs. What would you most prefer to read next and why?

#### **Creating**

- 1. Design a new character who could appear in the *Emmie and Friends* world. Draw them in a comic-style panel and write a short description of their personality, strengths, and a challenge they might face at school
- 2. Create a short graphic novel scene (4-8 panels) based on something from your own life like a funny moment at school or a time you felt nervous or excited. Use both pictures and words to show how you felt.
- 3. Terri Libenson defends graphic novels as "real reading". Create a poster, short speech, or comic strip that explains why you think graphic novels are valuable and fun to read. Convince others to give it a try!
- 4. Create a short, 30-60 second book trailer to promote your favourite Terri Libenson book, or the whole *Emmie and Friends* series.






### **Entirely Emmie**




### Surprisingly Sarah

Ruby and Mia are total opposites.


RUBY: A little awkward. Not a "joiner". Loves to write poetry.


MIA: Type A. Popular. Wants to be class president.




### **Becoming Brianna**





#### **Just Jamie**






















# Jacqueline Harvey Learning activities

#### Reflecting

- 1. Jacqueline Harvey says that all her stories are inspired by a love of mystery and adventure. Think about your favourite kinds of stories. What elements (e.g. mystery, humour, friendship, magic) do they usually include?
- 2. Jacqueline Harvey set *Alice-Miranda in Egypt* without ever visiting the country. What's a place you'd like to write a story about? How could you research if you couldn't travel there?
- 3. Jacqueline Harvey was asked which *Kensey and Max* character she'd be. Think about your favourite book. If you could swap places with one of the characters for a day, who would it be and why? What would you do in their world?
- 4. Look through the resource page with Jacqueline Harvey books and blurbs. What would you most prefer to read next and why?

#### **Creating**

- 1. Choose a character from one of Jacqueine Harvey's books. Create a passport for them that includes their name, an image or illustration, places they've travelled, special skills and a "top secret" fact.
- 2. Choose one of the locations that Jacqueline Havey has used in her stories (or create your own). Write a postcard from that character's point of view that:
  - a. Describes the setting
  - b. Describes what they've seen
  - c. Outlines a clue they've just discovered
- 3. In *The Girl and the Ghost,* a Josephine discovers a locket that contains a ghost. Imagine you are in Josephine's position. Write a diary entry reflecting on your discovery and how you are feeling.
- 4. Create a short, 30-60 second book trailer to promote your favourite Jacqueline Harvey book.




## Willa and Woof series

**Book 1 in series:** Breaking News


What would you do if you woke up in a strange place? If your whole life changed in


### Code Name: Mr Right series

Genre/s: Realistic fiction


**Book 1 in series:** Serrano Legacy

### Kevin the Sheep series


Why can't Kevin be more like the flock?!




#### Reflecting

- 1. Joel McKerrow shared how a cranky neighbour inspired a spooky character in *Urban Legend Hunters*. Have you ever met someone who could be a great book character? What made them memorable?
- 2. Joel talked about what it felt like to see his writing turned into illustrations. How do you think pictures can change or add to a story? Have you read a graphic novel where the images helped you understand the characters or mood?
- 3. Joel McKerrow states that poetry shapes all his writing. What kinds of stories or poems do **you** enjoy writing? What makes your writing style special or different?
- 4. Look through the resource page with Joel McKerrow books and blurbs. What would you most prefer to read next and why?

#### **Creating**

- 1. Invent a spooky or mysterious urban legend inspired by someone from your neighbourhood or entirely from your own imagination! Write a short description of the legend and draw that the character looks like.
- 2. Choose a strong emotion (e.g. joy, fear, anger, excitement). Write a short poem that expresses it. Try using unusual words, comparison or line breaks to show how the emotion feels. Remember: not all poems rhyme!
- 3. Imagine you're one of the student heroes from *The Great Chocolate Caper*. Plan your own heist! What's the mission? Who is on your team? Where are teh traps or secret passages? Create a floorplan or comic strip of the adventure.
- 4. Set a 10-minute timer and write the *worst* story you can think of bad grammar, wild plotholes, silly twists anything goes! Then reflect: What made it so bad... and what made it secretly fun?

Genre/s: Horror, mystery, graphic novel

Meet Jeremy Jubaya who loves telling tales that make your blood curdle, fearless Samantha Small who takes no nonsense and Bad Boris, who is, well... anything but bad!


This is not a fairytale. This is a hair-raising, spine-tingling, heart-pounding, hilarious adventure that is sure to scare everyone (except Samathan Small).

Magic tricks and misdirection, with a sideshow of clever robot trickery amidst secret tunnels in Sydney's iconic harbour, make this heist especially spectacular!




















### Jared Thomas Learning activities

#### Reflecting

- 1. Jared Thomas shared how his uncles and family helped both him and his stories. Think about someone in your family or community who has taught you something important. What did you learn from them?
- 2. Jared Thomas says it's important to write stories grounded in your own experience. Why do you think that makes a story feel more real or powerful? Have you ever written something inspired by your own life?
- 3. Jared Thomas writes for both younger and older readers. What do you think would be different about writing for kids your age compared to writing for teenagers?
- 4. Look through the resource page with Jared Thomas's books and blurbs. What would you most prefer to read next and why?

#### **Creating**


- 1. Jared Thomas likes starting stories with a "what if" question. Come up with your own (e.g. what if my pet could talk? What if my classroom turned into a spaceship?). Answer these questions, then use these answers to write a short story outline.
- 2. Write a persuasive letter to Jared Thomas asking him to write a story about cricket. Include ideas for the plot, setting, characters, and why you think it would be a great read for young people.
- 3. Think about a tradition, culture or custom that is important to you or your family. Create a short comic, story or poem that includes this cultural element and shows why it matters.
- 4. Create a short, 30-60 second book trailer to promote one of Jared Thomas's books.

Patty expects to be a great basketballer straight away, just like his uncle Danny. But he soon discovers there's whole lot more to the game than just shooting hoops.


He's got a lot to learn, on and off the court - and it's going to take plenty of practice.
